## Pharmaceuticals Drop-Off

The Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) site still accepts most unwanted pharmaceuticals and over-the-counter medications.

**Because of regulations, the HHM site can no longer accept pharmaceuticals regulated as controlled substances. These include**

- prescription painkillers
- stimulants
- strong sedatives
- muscle relaxants
- steroids
- codeine

Special collection events to collect all unwanted pharmaceuticals **including controlled substances** will be held on four dates in 2012:

**February 18; spring, summer, and fall collection dates will be advertised.**

All e-waste is sent to a recycler that is registered with the Wisconsin DNR.

## E-Waste Recycling

**Electronics are BANNED from disposal in Wisconsin landfills or incinerators—they MUST be recycled.** For more information on recycling electronic waste in Wisconsin, visit <http://dnr.wi.gov/org/aw/wm/ecycle/index.htm>

- Cable/satellite TV equipment

**Not accepted:** dehumidifiers, air conditioners, anything with coolant or Freon

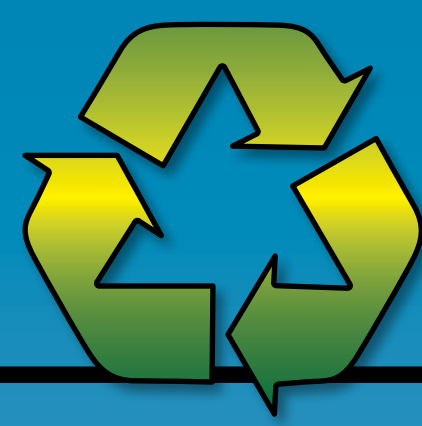
## What Are the Environmental Benefits of Reusing and Recycling E-Waste?

Electronic products are made from valuable resources, such as precious and other metals, plastics, and glass, all of which require energy to mine and manufacture. Reusing and recycling these materials from end-of-life electronics conserves our natural resources and avoids air and water pollution caused by mining and the manufacturing new products.

For example:

- Recycling one million laptops saves the energy equivalent to the electricity used by 3,657 U.S. homes in a year.
- One ton of circuit boards can contain 40 to 800 times the amount of gold and 30 to 40 times the amount of copper mined from one ton of ore in the United States.
- By recycling 100 million cell phones, 3.4 tons of gold is recovered.

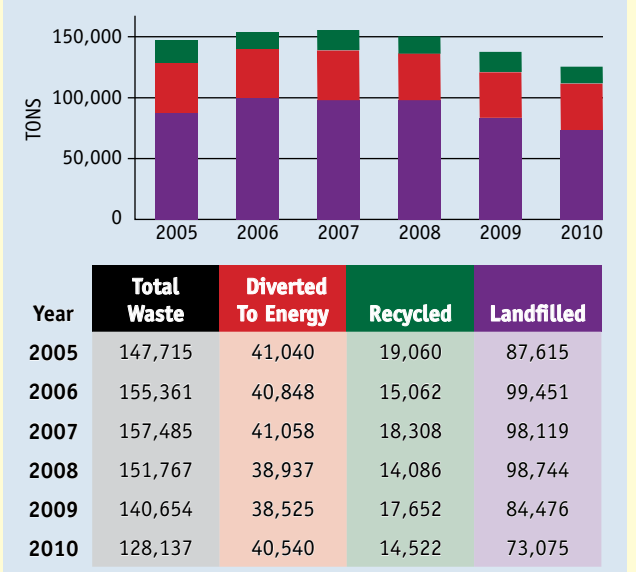

## Public Use of County Landfill

La Crosse County's easily accessible public drop-off site at 6500 Highway 16 is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. We accept waste from homeowners, renters, and businesses located around the region. There are eight numbered and labeled containers so that you can separate your waste appropriately. Disposal fees are 5¢ per pound, payable at the site (minimum \$2). Your vehicle will be weighed upon entering and leaving the landfill site to determine cost. There is a 3% convenience fee (minimum \$2 per transaction) for the use of credit or debit cards. **You must stop at the scale to be weighed, and you must provide your own labor.**



## Waste Diversion Rates



The above graph illustrates the disposal and diversion of waste within the La Crosse County system. This includes all the waste sent to the Xcel Energy plant and the La Crosse County Landfill, but excludes the waste recycled curbside. In 2010 over 74,000 tons of waste was sent to Xcel and over 86,000 tons to the landfill. The Solid Waste Department and Xcel Energy helped reduce the amount of waste going into the landfill by diverting this valuable resource into either energy production or recycling programs.

Some of these programs include converting used shingles from a waste product into material that can be used in reducing the amount of asphalt for roads. Clean wood waste is ground up and sold to Xcel Energy to produce energy, and waste concrete is crushed and used for other applications including a replacement for gravel on roads. Other wastes that are recycled include tires, scrap metal, yard waste, and cardboard.

Because of these successful diversion programs over 42 percent of all waste sent into the solid waste system in 2010 was recycled or reused. This reduces the impact of these wastes on our environment because they become a resource instead of a waste; this will also help keep our existing landfill space available for many more years, eliminating the need to locate another landfill within our region.

## What Can Be Dropped Off?

**Large Items:** Furniture and furnishings including upholstered items, general household waste, toys, bikes, grills, lawnmowers (without gas and oil), mattresses, stoves, hot water heaters, washers, dryers, small appliances, etc.

**Clothing & Shoes**

**Demolition/Construction Debris:** Wood, drywall, doors, windows, sinks, toilets, tubs, roofing, bricks, carpets, tile, flooring.

**Garbage:** Normal household waste like bagged waste, paper, and food waste. Place in the Xcel waste-to-energy bin.

**Other:** Yard waste/grass clippings, shingles, brush, and animal carcasses.

**Tires:** May be dropped off for a higher fee.

## What Cannot Be Dropped Off?

Hazardous waste, propane tanks, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, air conditioners, and anything else with Freon or coolant cannot be accepted.

## No Salvaging

Only people authorized by site attendants may use the facility. Security cameras are in use, and violators will be referred to law enforcement.

## La Crosse County Sharps Collection Program

Household generated "sharps" are accepted at the La Crosse County Hazardous Materials Facility FREE of charge from La Crosse County residents. (Business and out-of-county generated sharps are accepted by appointment and for a fee.)

**Never place loose sharps in the garbage.**

The following sharps are accepted:

- Needles
- Syringes
- Lancets
- Test strips
- PICC lines

**Procedure:**

- Place the sharps in puncture resistant containers (either a registered red sharps container or a thick plastic container such as a laundry detergent or bleach bottle).
- Label the container "SHARPS" and lock the lid.
- Bring the container to the Household Hazardous Materials Facility.



**NOTE: If the sharps are in a container other than the two listed above, they will not be accepted.**

Because loose sharps are dangerous, a HHM technician cannot remove sharps from a container.

# Disposal of Yard Waste, Brush, Twigs, Leaves, Christmas Trees, Large Items & Tires

## Yard Waste, Leaves, and Grass Clippings

Leaves, grass clippings, garden and flower bed debris may be placed in the concrete bunker in the Shelby Annex parking lot at 2801 Ward Avenue **from April through November only**. (Note: When purchasing a new lawn mower, consider a mulching mower and leave grass clippings on the lawn.)

## Brush (O on calendar)

Brush and tree limbs up to 8 inches in diameter should be placed curbside with the larger end facing the street. Brush should be placed loosely and in smaller piles rather than one large pile. It does not have to be cut into short lengths. **Brush will not be picked up unless you are on the "brush list."** To be placed on the brush list, e-mail [gloria.johnson@townofshelby.com](mailto:gloria.johnson@townofshelby.com) or call 788-1032 ext. 3 by Tuesday of the week the Town crew is chipping brush.

See calendar for brush pickup schedule. Note that brush will no longer be picked up during winter months.

**Trees and limbs larger than 8 inches in diameter or brush amounts larger than one pickup load (6 ft x 4 ft x 4 ft) will not be chipped by the town crew.** You must contract with a tree service at your own expense. Brush chipping is a service to the residents and is to be used on an occasional basis only. It is not for larger properties with many trees to use on a constant basis. Properties repeatedly using this service will be notified that their brush will not be picked up and chipped. You may consider applying for a permit to burn brush if you have adequate space and a water supply.

## Christmas Trees and Wreaths (Δ on calendar)

Place curbside with trash. The town will pick up these items **starting December 27, 2011, and ending January 13, 2012.**

## Large Item Dropoff (□ on calendar)

Large metal items, household items such as furniture, carpeting (up to 1 room), appliances, TVs, computers, and tires may be dropped off at the Shelby Annex parking lot on the Large Item collection days marked on the calendar opposite. **Charges to cover the cost of recycling large items that are banned from landfills will be posted at the site.** Please note:

- Recycling of TVs, computers, monitors, and printers

is required. The Town of Shelby is a state-certified e-waste collector. We charge a nominal fee to cover the cost of handling and recycling e-waste.

- Leftover paint in cans or aerosol dispensers, and old gasoline in a secure container, can be brought to the **first and last Large Item Dropoff Days** (April 14 and November 10).

- If you prefer not to wait for the large item dropoff days, you may recycle **appliances** at Scientific Recycling, Dynamic Recycling, Hilltopper Refuse and Recycling, or La Crosse County Household Hazardous Waste Facility. Addresses and phone numbers for these facilities are listed in "Contact Information."

**Large item dropoff is for items too large for regular curb service and is not intended for large quantities of smaller debris. Quantities are limited to one pickup load per day and will be strictly enforced. You must use a commercial refuse/recycling service to dispose of construction and demolition debris.**

25% of the materials brought to the Large Item Dropoff could be disposed of with the regular weekly curbside pickup. If items fit in a garbage can or can be broken down to fit in a garbage can, place them curbside with the rest of your trash, especially if they are burnable. Items placed in the Large Item dumpsters are sent to the La Crosse County Landfill, not the Xcel RDF facility.

## Cardboard

Cardboard should be placed curbside with the weekly trash. It is burned to produce electricity at the Xcel RDF Facility on French Island. Empty cardboard boxes should be broken down and should be folded if they are large.

## Open Burning

You must obtain a **permit to burn brush or for campfires outside of a campground.** Permit applications are available online at [www.townofshelby.com](http://www.townofshelby.com) on the fire department page or at the Town Hall. Burning **garbage or leaves is illegal** and hazardous to the environment. Violators will be issued a citation.



## Curbside Trash Guidelines

**Collection Days**  
Trash is picked up weekly, Tuesday through Thursday. Please refer to the map at right, or you may call the Town Hall, 788-1032, to find out which day of the week is your collection day.

## Containers

**Plastic or metal trash containers must not exceed 32 gallons** in size and must be of commercial grade with handles and covers. The top of the container must be larger than the bottom. **Filled containers must not weigh more than 60 pounds.**

You may put your trash in **plastic garbage bags** that are secured at the opening. Filled bags must not weigh more than 40 pounds.

## Placement of Containers

Place containers within 2 feet of the surfaced edge of the road by 5:00 a.m. on collection days. Empty containers must be removed within 24 hours after collection.

## Unacceptable Trash

Yard waste, large items such as appliances and furniture, carpeting, e-waste, construction and demolition materials, brush, and trees.

# 2012 Town of Shelby Trash & Recycling Pickup Schedules

## How to Prepare Recyclables

### GLASS: Jars and bottles only!

- **NO** light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window glass, mirrors, or ceramics.
- Remove lids and metal rings, empty, and rinse clean.



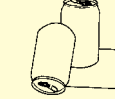
### TIN CANS: Empty food, paint, aerosol cans only!

- **NO** chemicals, scrap metal, or vehicle parts.
- Empty, rinse clean, and remove labels. Ends of cans can stay attached. Flattening of food cans is appreciated.



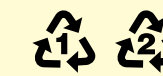
### ALUMINUM: Cans only!

- **NO** food or pie plates
- Drain liquid and rinse cans clean. Flattening is appreciated.



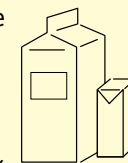
### PLASTIC: Bottles only!

- **NO** plastic packaging, ice cream buckets, food containers, or Styrofoam.
- Look for #1 or #2 mark (milk jugs, soda and water bottles).
- Rinse clean; discard cap.



### CARTONS: **NEW!** Milk, juice, broth, soup, and other food & beverage cartons

- **What is a carton?** It's a type of food and beverage packaging. There are two types: **shelf-stable** (broth, soup, soy milk, juice, milk, wine) and **refrigerated** (milk, juice, cream, egg substitutes).
- Drain liquid.

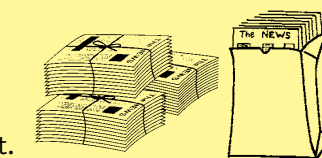


**Please Note:** The Town recycles **ONLY** the items listed in this brochure. Items such as cardboard, plastic packaging, and nonrecyclable containers should be placed in your regular trash.

Place glass, tin cans, aluminum cans, plastic, and cartons together loosely in recycling bin.

## NEWSPAPERS/MAGAZINES

- **NO** junk mail.
- Newspapers (including shiny inserts), magazines, and telephone books are acceptable.
- Keep papers as dry as possible! If rain/snow is predicted, please wait until your next recycling week to set out.



Bundle newspapers and magazines with cotton string or place in a brown paper grocery bag and place beside your blue recycling bin.

## Trash Pickup

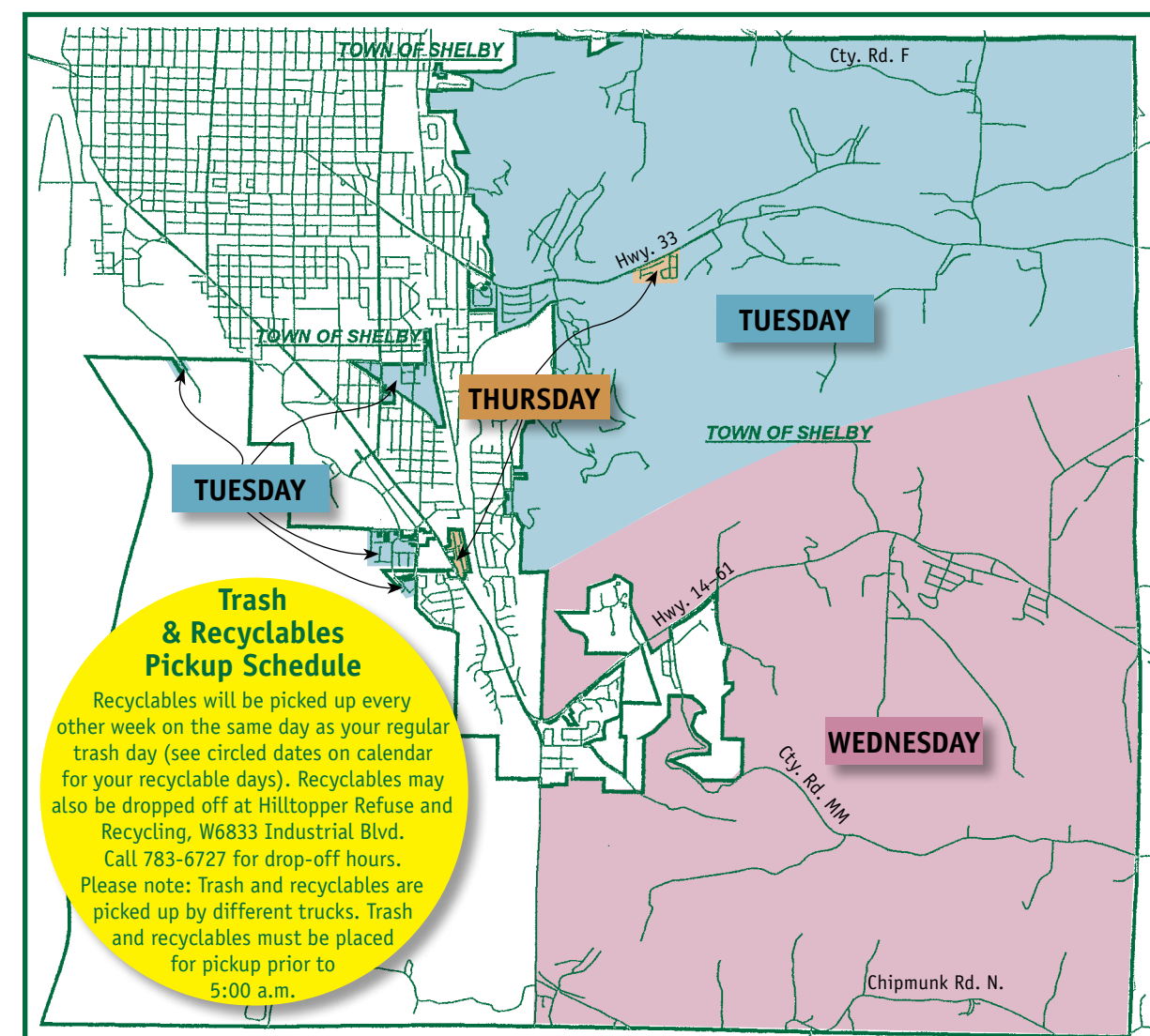
Trash is collected once a week on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, according to the color-coded areas on the map at right and the calendar below. When a holiday falls on one of these days, collection will be delayed for one day. Trash is taken to the Excel Energy Refuse Derived Fuel Plant on French Island and is converted to electricity.

## Recycling Pickup

Collection takes place every other week on the same day as refuse collection. See the 2012 Refuse and Recycling Calendar below. Place recyclables for pickup beside your regular refuse, within 2 feet of the surfaced edge of the road, by 5:00 a.m. on collection day.

## Recycling Bins

If you move, the blue recycling bin should be left at the Shelby residence for the subsequent owner. New or replacement bins may be purchased at the Town Hall for a fee of \$9.00. If you built a new home in the Town of Shelby, the fee for your recycling bin was included with your building permit. Please stop by the Town Hall to pick up your bin.



**Trash & Recyclables Pickup Schedule**  
Recyclables will be picked up every other week on the same day as your regular trash day (see circled dates on calendar for your recyclable days). Recyclables may also be dropped off at Hilltopper Refuse and Recycling, W6833 Industrial Blvd. Call 783-6727 for drop-off hours. Please note: Trash and recyclables are picked up by different trucks. Trash and recyclables must be placed for pickup prior to 5:00 a.m.

Items include: roofing materials, bath tubs, shower enclosures, windows, sheet rock, brick, concrete, asphalt, and kitchen cabinets. Please contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling (783-6727) for details on how to dispose of these items.

### Regulated hazardous materials

Cleaners, solvents, gasoline, oil, or other toxic, corrosive, explosive, or highly combustible materials may not be placed in the regular trash. These hazardous materials should be taken to the Hazardous Materials Facility (785-9999). See front page for details.
