The Shelby Police Department is reminding all residents that lawn grasses and noxious weeds on personal property should be maintained and should be no longer than 8 inches in length. This regulation is in accordance with Shelby Ordinances and is meant to promote the safety, health, and general welfare of our community.

Are you resealing or resurfacing your Driveway this summer?

Driveway permits are required for reconstruction or resurfacing of existing driveways. It allows the Town an opportunity to review drainage and determine if the driveway culvert needs to be replaced. These permits are available at the Town Hall and are **FREE** of charge. Please, do not replace a culvert under the driveway or replace concrete or asphalt on your driveway until you have been issued a permit. Allow at least **3 days** for a permit to be processed and issued. Please acquire a permit **BEFORE** you start your driveway project.

Septic Replacement Assistance:

The Town of Shelby can help property owners who need to replace a failing septic system. Loans are available at a low rate of interest through the Shelby Utility District. Annual payments are made as a special assessment placed on property tax bills. Contact the town at 788-1032 ext. 6 OR email info@townofshelby.com for more information.

Large Item Drop Off

Large Item drop off is the 2nd Saturday of the month during the months of May-November, from 7am-Noon. There is no large item drop off in July. Please consult your Recycler Calendar for acceptable and unacceptable items. Large amounts of cardboard are not acceptable, however Festival Foods has a recycling container to use free of charge. Paints, light bulbs and chemicals are not accepted and must be taken to La Crosse landfill.

LEAF / GRASS BIN

There is a concrete bunker located near the Town shop on 28th Street for residents to drop off grass clippings, leaves and garden debris only,...not for brush or tree limbs. This material is spread on a farm field and used for compost.

All garbage & recycling needs to fit into the carts provided. For additional items, go to Large item drop off OR a sheet of 5 additional bag stickers may be purchased at the Town Hall for \$15.

BRUSH CHIPPING

As you all know, we have a lot of projects happening in Shelby this summer. Our crew works tirelessly to try and get these projects done in a timely manner. To increase efficiency brush chipping will be on the following dates: July 15-16, August 12-13, September 23-24, October 21-23, and November 18-20. Tree limbs may be any length but are limited to 8 inches or less in diameter and should be piled loosely and spread out by the roadside, cut ends toward the street. **ONE LOAD PER RESIDENCE PER PICK UP CYCLE. Brush piles are limited in size to 4'X4'X8'.** If you have additional brush, you can take it to the La Crosse County Landfill, apply for a burn permit on our website or hire a tree service.



FIREWORKS

NO PERMIT of FEE is required if you are using the fireworks the 4 days prior and 4 days after the 4th of July Holiday. In the event of a burn ban, NO fireworks use will be permitted.

*Please note that there are NO fireworks allowed in ANY town Park.

NEW FIRE TRUCK/ROAD CREW TRUCK

In January, some of our Fire Department members drove to Lyons, South Dakota to pick up the new fire truck. This engine was equipped early on to respond to automobile accidents, but as of this summer it will be fully stocked and ready to respond to all incidents from automobile accidents to large structure fires. We are very excited for this new addition!



In May of this year, the Town was able to pick up this new truck! The Road Crew is very excited about this new machine. It will be replacing one of our older trucks that has served the community for many years but is no longer reliable enough to have in full service. Our crew is excited to get to work on projects this summer!



Excavation/Right of Way/Dumpster Permits

Excavation/Right of Way/Dumpster Permits are required before placing any structure (a dumpster for example) in the road right-of-way. In most cases they are not allowed. No obstructions may be placed in the Town road right-of-way without a permit. This includes trees and shrubs, lawn watering systems, in addition any structures that may be damaged or destroyed by plow trucks or utility installments are not allowed.

Any activity within the Road Right of Way must be approved by the Town. This includes dumpsters, construction materials and machines, excavation, plantings, down spout or drain tile, or general landscaping.

SHELBY YOUTH BALL

The Town of Shelby announces the partial closure of facilities and the cancellation of Shelby Youth Ball (SYB) for the 2020 Season. The Town had hoped the pandemic situation would improve, but the increased concern of COVID-19 led the Town Board to this difficult decision on June 16, 2020. The safety of the public and SYB participants is most important, and this action will help reduce the potential for gatherings. For the 2020 Season, there will be no rental of park shelters or fields and no organized sports. The parks, trails, and fields will remain open, and everyone is encouraged to enjoy time outdoors while practicing social distancing.
