Mattress RECYCLING

1. When you purchase a new mattress, ask the local mattress store to recycle your old one; or
2. For home pick-up of an old mattress, without the purchase of a new one, contact a hauler that will recycle your mattress; or
3. Take your mattress to the Citizen's Drop-off area at the County Landfill for a fee or contact 7 Rivers Recycling at 608-781-0257 to find other drop-off locations.

Landfill Fees*

These fees apply to garbage (normal household waste), large items (furniture, toys, bikes, grills, stoves, washers, dryers, and small appliances) and demolition/construction (wood, drywall, doors, flooring, windows, sinks, and roofing). Other materials such as brush, yard waste, tires, and freon containing appliances (air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and refrigerators) have different fees. See our website at www.lacrossecounty.org/solidwaste for a complete list of fees*

- Garbage/Demolition/Construction waste:** \$120/ton
- Trailers, Cargo Van, UHAULS, Businesses (Including Landlords):** \$15 service fee + \$62/ton by weight
- Mattresses and Box Springs:** \$15
- Microwaves:** \$10



PLEASE NOTE: There is a 2.5% convenience fee for the use of credit and debit cards

All landfill customers must drive onto the inbound scale. Only people authorized by site attendants may use the facility. You must provide your own labor for unloading materials. Due to safety concerns, we do not permit salvaging once waste is placed in the container.

* PLEASE READ SIGNAGE*

Things have changed at the landfill. The Solid Waste Department recently redesigned the entrance to the Landfill site on Highway 16 to improve efficiency and safety. Our new site address is 3240 Berlin Drive. The diagram to the right illustrates this new entrance. Department staff are available at the main office, the Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) facility and the new scale facility to provide further instruction when you enter the site. The landfill entrance now features two scales, inbound and outbound. All customers must scale in on the inbound scale. Access to the main office has also changed. The entrance door and parking are now located on the southeast side of the building. Access to the Reuse Room is now located directly across from the HHM canopy. For information on changes to the Household Hazardous Materials Facility Entrance and the Reuse Room please see the reverse side of this flyer.

Curbside Trash

Trash will be picked up weekly, Tuesday and Wednesday. Please look at the map on page 3 to see your day of collection. Residents living on streets north of Ward Avenue, including Pleasant Valley Estates and Coachlite Village, and subdivisions accessed off of Hwy 33, will be picked up on Tuesday. Those living south of Ward Avenue, including La Crosse Mobile Home Court, the Cliffside Drive & Easter Road areas, Boschert Subdivision and Hanifl Road will be picked up on Wednesday.

CART Collection System:

Residents are required to use the carts provided to you by the Town for trash collection and recycling. These will be the ONLY containers that are picked up. If you move, the carts remain with the residence. Carts have a 10 year warranty from the manufacturer. If they lose a wheel, the lid comes off, or other "normal" repair, the cart will be repaired or exchanged by Hilltopper. There is no cost to the resident for these types of "normal" repairs. If the resident is negligent and the carts are damaged they will be responsible for the replacement costs.

Please do not mark or spray paint your carts. A luggage tag or zip tie may be placed on the cart to mark your address.

Additional Trash:

Trash set beside your cart, put out in bags or a can, will NOT be collected. You can wait and put the extra trash in the cart for the next collection, or make other arrangements. Some options include: hauling it yourself to the La Crosse County Landfill or to Hilltopper for a small fee, or purchasing stickers from the Town for curbside collection. These stickers are to be used on the handle of the bag (where bag is tied shut) and set out with your cart. Only one sticker per bag, no cans will be collected. This is for occasional extra trash. You can purchase these stickers directly from the Town. It is \$15 for 5 tags. If you continually have more refuse & recycling than fits in your carts and you need an additional carts, contact Hilltopper at 783-6727 and make arrangements to have an additional carts delivered. There is an additional annual charge for additional carts. You will be billed directly by Hilltopper.

Placement of Carts:

Place carts at **least 3 feet away from obstacles** including but not limited to: other carts, mailboxes, power poles, etc. Place carts within 2 feet of the surfaced edge of the road, but not on the road even in Winter, with the wheels facing away from the road. Carts should be set out by 5 am on collection day. Empty carts must be removed from the roadside by 5 pm the day following collection.

Trash unacceptable to place in cart:

Do not put grass, leaves, brush, recyclables, electronics, computer components, demolition or construction materials in the cart. See below for information on disposal of these items.

If your garbage or recycling is not picked up, please contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling immediately at 783-6727.

Large Item Dropoff (Yellow Box on calendar)

Large metal items, household items such as furniture, carpeting (up to 1 room), appliances, TVs, computers, and tires may be dropped off at the Shelby Annex parking lot on the Large Item collection days marked on the calendar opposite. **Charges to cover the cost of recycling large items that are banned from landfills will be posted at the site.** Please note:

- Recycling of TVs, computers, monitors, and printers is required. The Town of Shelby is a state-certified e-waste collector. We charge a nominal fee to cover the cost of handling and recycling e-waste. **However, The Town will hold a FREE E-Waste EVENT on Wednesday, January 2nd, 2019 from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm for residents at Town Shop to dispose of broken or obsolete electronic items AT NO CHARGE. If there is a snowstorm on 1/2/18, the alternate day for the event is January 9th, 2019 from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm.**

We are also adding a FREE dumpster for cardboard recycling to E-Waste Day. Flatten your cardboard and bring it to the Town Shop dumpster on 1/2/18.

- If you want to dispose of material, including large items, e-waste, appliances and other recyclables, construction and demolition debris take a load to Hilltopper Refuse or La Crosse County Landfill. Your load will be weighed and you will be charged a nominal fee for disposal of the materials. See Contact Information listed below for the addresses and phone numbers to contact both of them.

Large item dropoff is for items too large for regular curb service and is not intended for large quantities of smaller debris. **25% of the materials brought to the Large Item Drop Off should have been disposed of with the regular weekly curbside collection.** If items fit in the trash cart or can be broken down to fit, they should be placed in the cart, especially if they are burnable, as trash is sent to Xcel Energy's waste facility and is burned to produce electricity. Items that should be placed in the trash cart but are brought to Large Item Drop Off will be turned away, because items placed in the dumpsters go to the La Crosse County Landfill where the Town is charged an additional disposal fee. You must use a commercial refuse/recycling service to dispose of construction and demolition debris.

Unacceptable Trash in Weekly Collection

Construction, demolition, or commercial materials include: Roofing materials, bath tubs, shower enclosures, windows, sheet rock, brick, concrete, asphalt, and kitchen cabinets. Please contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling (783-6727) for details on how to dispose of these items.

Hazardous materials: Paint, cleaners, solvents, gasoline, oil, or other toxic, corrosive, explosive, or highly combustible materials may not be placed in the regular trash. Refer to the front page to see which hazardous materials are accepted at the La Crosse County Household Hazardous Materials Site.

If in question, call the facility for a recommendation at 608-785-9999.

Yard Waste, Leaves, and Grass Clippings

Leaves, grass clippings, garden and flower bed debris may be placed in the concrete bunker in the Shelby Annex parking lot at 2801 Ward Avenue **from April through November 15th.** (Note: When purchasing a new lawn mower, consider a mulching mower and leave grass clippings on the lawn.)

Brush & Campfire Burn Permits

You must obtain a **permit to burn brush or for campfires** outside of a campground. **FREE** permit applications are available online at www.townofshelby.com on the fire department page or at the Town Hall. Burning **garbage or leaves** is **illegal** and hazardous to the environment. Violators will be issued a citation. Brush permits are for one time use. Fire ring permits are valid anytime, once you have an approved fire ring permit you do not have to re-apply each year as long as the owner, the address, and location of pit stay the same. If the smoke from your fire is bothering your neighbors and is reported the Fire Dept. will have to extinguish the fire.



Brush (on calendar)

Brush and tree limbs up to 8 inches in diameter should be placed curbside with the larger end facing the street. Brush should be placed loosely and in smaller piles rather than one large pile. It does not have to be cut into short lengths. **Brush will not be picked up unless you are on the "brush list."** To be placed on the brush list, e-mail info@townofshelby.com or **call the brush hotline at 788-1032 ext. 6** by Tuesday of the week the Town crew is chipping brush.

See calendar for brush pickup schedule. Note that brush will **NOT** be picked up during the winter.

Trees and limbs larger than 8 inches in diameter or brush amounts larger than one pickup load (6 ft x 4 ft x 4 ft) will not be chipped by the town crew. You must contract with a tree service at your own expense. Brush chipping is a service to the residents and is to be used on an occasional basis only. It is not for larger properties with many trees to use on a constant basis. Properties repeatedly using this service will be notified that their brush will not be picked up and chipped. You may consider applying for a permit to burn brush if you have adequate space and a water supply.

Christmas Trees (on calendar)

Place curbside with trash. The town will pick up these items starting Wednesday Jan. 2nd - Friday Jan. 12th. **The last day the Town will pick up these trees is Friday, 1/11/19. Please place on top of snow pile.**



Single Stream Recycling - How to Prepare Recyclables

GLASS: Jars and bottles only!

- **NO** light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window glass, mirrors, or ceramics.
- Remove lids and metal rings, empty, and rinse clean.



TIN & ALUMINUM

Bottles and Cans:
Pots & pans, empty paint & aerosol cans, Aluminum foil, steel cans

- **NO** chemicals, scrap metal, or vehicle parts, electronics
- Empty, rinse clean. Ends of cans can stay attached.



PLASTIC:

Due to the decline in the plastics recycling market and the inability to find recyclers/end markets who accept plastics #3-#7, as of January 1, we now only accept #1-#2.

- Rinse clean, discard cap in garbage.



FOOD & BEVERAGE

CARTONS:
Milk, juice, broth, soup, and other

- **What is a carton?** There are two types: **shelf-stable** (broth, soup, soy milk, juice, milk, wine) and **refrigerated** (milk, juice, cream, egg substitutes).
- Drain liquid.

WIRES:
Christmas lights, extension cords and power cords

Items can co-mingle.

Additional Acceptable Materials for Recycling - Paper and Cardboard: Newspapers, magazines, cereal, soda and beer boxes, paperback books, phone books, paper bags, mail/junk mail.

Non-Acceptable Materials for Recycling - Plastic bags, kitchen garbage bags, batteries, photographs, styrofoam, packing peanuts, regular trash, yard waste, light bulbs, dishes, glass from mirrors or windows and electronics

Recyclables are to be placed loosely in the recycling cart with the yellow lid.



Safe Transportation of Hazardous Materials

1. If possible, bring items in their original containers, or clearly mark contents on container. If you do not know what is in the container, tell the attendant.
2. Tighten all covers and lids.
3. **NEVER MIX CHEMICALS!**
4. If a container is leaking, pack it separately in a leak-proof container (i.e. pail or tub)
5. Do not load wastes in the passenger compartment of a vehicle.
6. Avoid spills. Put waste containers, upright, in a sturdy container and place them securely in the trunk or back of a truck or van.
7. **Do not put different types of wastes into a garbage bag.**
8. Read and follow all directions when you arrive at the Household Hazardous Materials Facility.
9. Gasoline and Used Oil should be transported in approved safety gas cans. Approved containers can be emptied and returned to the customer.



Unacceptable Materials at HHM

- Ammunition
- Black Powder
- Explosives
- Fireworks
- Radioactive Materials
- Compressed Gas Cylinders
- Shock or Heat-Sensitive Materials (Peroxide, Picric Acid)



SAVE YOURSELF A TRIP!

These items can and should go into your regular curbside trash or recycling:

- Empty paint and aerosol cans (recycling bin)
- Dried out paint cans (trash bin)
- Alkaline batteries (trash bin)
- Incandescent light bulbs (trash bin)

Sharps and Needles

"Sharps" must be brought to HHM in puncture resistant containers, including a registered, red "Sharps" container or a thick plastic laundry detergent bottle with a screw type cap.

NOTE: No other container will be accepted.

Acceptable Materials at HHM

- Pesticides, herbicides, rodenticides and other lawn and garden chemicals
- Paint, stain and varnish
- Oil, gasoline and other automotive fluids
- Household cleaning products
- Pool chemicals
- Fluorescent and compact fluorescent light bulbs
- Rechargeable, lead acid and lithium batteries
- Mercury thermometers, thermostats with mercury in them and other small mercury containing devices
- Sharps (see "Sharps and Needles" for proper packaging instructions)
- Handheld propane cylinders

E-Waste Recycling

These items are accepted at the Household Hazardous Materials Facility. Fees apply as noted (\$):

- TV's and computer monitors \$
- Video playing devices: VCR's, DVD players, gaming consoles, cable tv receivers etc.
- Computers: desktop towers/CPU's, laptops, tablets
- Computer accessories: printers, scanners, fax machines, keyboards, speakers, mice, external hard drives, flash drives/USB's, etc.
- Cell phones and digital cameras
- Microwaves and small Freon appliances \$

Fee Applies – see website or call for current pricing information. TVs and other electronics that have been salvaged or disassembled will be charged a fee per pound.

NON-HOUSEHOLD USERS?

Many businesses and organizations, including farms, in-home businesses, rental properties (landlords), churches, schools and municipalities generate small amounts of hazardous waste and are looking for an efficient means to dispose of such items. The current agreement between La Crosse County and all participating municipalities mandates that qualifying businesses and organizations must pay for the disposal of their materials at the HHM facility.

Steps for businesses and organizations:

1. Prequalification is required. Call 785-9999 or visit: www.lacrossecounty.org/solidwaste/hhm to get qualification information, pricing and forms.
2. Fill out and return the "VERY SMALL QUANTITY GENERATORS (VSQG) CERTIFICATION FORM" and the "WASTE INVENTORY FORM". The completed forms can be emailed to hhm@lacrossecounty.org
3. Once the forms have been submitted to and approved by HHM staff, we will call you to set up an appointment to drop off your materials. Businesses and organizations will not be allowed to drop off waste without an appointment.
